Please note: Airport transfers are not included in the fees.

Accommodation in Norwich

Homestay accommodation is provided in single study-bedrooms with carefully selected hosts. It comprises bed, breakfast & evening meal each day and light lunch (or packed lunch as appropriate) at weekends.

Residential accommodation is provided on campus at the University of East Anglia in single study bedrooms with private bathroom. The accommodation is on a bed & breakfast (B&B) basis in university houses or flats with a shared kitchen/dining room, fully equipped for self-catering.

Key features include:

f Accommodation in carefully selected homestay accommodation on a half-board basis. Residential accommodation is available at the University of East Anglia from June to September and by arrangement at certain other times.

f Materials, including course file, handouts, city map, information on Norwich and attendance certificate

f Use of resource centre and library

f Free Internet access and use of computer centre

f Social programme comprising evening activities and weekend excursions to places of interest e.g. Cambridge and the Norfolk Coast
